School Value-Added	<i>Reports / ...School Reports / ...Value Added</i>	Up to three years of growth results by grade level and subject, benchmarked to the state's overall performance. Use the "Subjects" tab in the upper-right hand corner of the screen to toggle between subjects/courses.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Click on any underlined value in the <i>School Effect</i> column to access the School Diagnostic report for that subject/grade.
School Diagnostic	<i>Reports / ...School Reports / ...Diagnostic</i>	Most recent year's growth results disaggregated by predicted achievement quintile (lowest 20%, 20-40%, etc.), compared to average of previous years. Use the "Subjects" tab in the upper-right hand corner of the screen to toggle between subjects/courses, and use the "Grades" tab to toggle between grade levels (Elem/MS only). More specific disaggregations are available by clicking on the "Select Subgroups" box beneath the report title.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Click on either the mean or the N count for any quintile group in the table to see the predicted vs. actual scores for the individual students in that group. Click on the subject/test in the table to see the predicted vs. actual scores for all students in all groups in a single list.
School Academic Preparedness	<i>Reports / ...Other Reports / ...School Academic Preparedness</i>	A breakdown of the percentage of students in the school by their likelihood of passing a future EOG or EOC test. Use the "Projections" tab in the upper-right hand corner of the screen to toggle between tests, and use the "Grades" tab to toggle between grade levels (Elem/MS only).	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Click on either the "pie slices" or the number of students in the table to see the actual students that are in each probability category.
Decision Dashboard	<i>Reports / ...School Reports / ...Decision Dashboard</i>	Summarizes all value-added and diagnostic reporting in a single report. This report includes value added gain categories for all subjects and grades tested, multi-year average gains, and gains of students at different achievement levels.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Click on the <i>Group By</i> menu (located in the center of the report) to display results by subject. The default layout is organized by test/grade.
Scatterplot	<i>Reports / ...Custom Reports / ...Scatterplot</i>	The scatterplot feature is an interactive graphing tool that allows users to select the variables of interest (growth versus achievement, growth versus student characteristics, etc.) and plot district or school data.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Click on the + symbol beside the <i>Wake County Schools</i> link to add schools individually to your scatterplot.
Student Pattern Report	<i>Reports / ...Other Reports / ...Student Pattern Reports /</i>	This report disaggregates progress for specific students of your choosing. The Student Pattern report enables you to see how effective the school has been with the lowest, middle, and highest achieving students in the group you have selected.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> A minimum of fifteen students <i>with both current and previous year NCEs</i> must be chosen in order to generate a report. Click on any student from the resulting report to get a graphical display of that student's projection with relevant history.
Custom Student Reports	<i>Reports / ...Custom Reports / ...Custom Student Reports</i>	Provides a menu of options for creating your own custom report on any individual student(s). You can specify students based on specific grade levels and subgroups. You can also select for students that have certain probabilities of passing future tests. These reports can be "saved" and re-run again in the future.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Click on any student from the resulting report to get a graphical display of that student's projection with relevant history.
